Mpox can be treated by managing symptoms. Antiviral drugs are occasionally used for severe cases

Here's what you need to know



Transmission

- skin-to-skin contact
- touching bodily fluids of someone who has mpox
- contact with infected objects (ex. bedding, towels)
- large respiratory droplets



Early Signs & Symptoms

It can take up to 21 days to develop symptoms.

- fever (>38 C), chills
- swollen lymph nodes
- headache
- muscle/joint pain
- backache
- sore throat
- cough
- stuffy nose
- exhaustion
- extreme weakness
- rash/blisters on face, palms of the hands, & soles of the feet within 1-3 days
